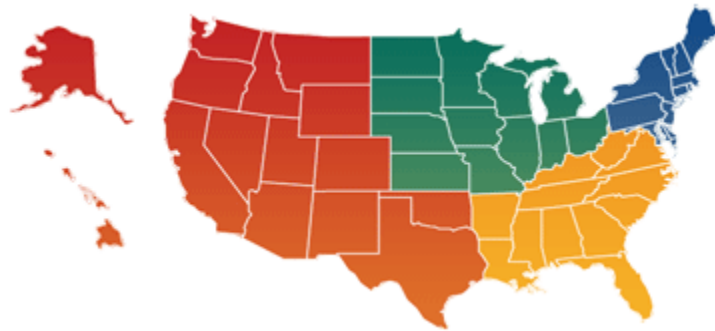
Major Talking Points:

1. For the eighth year in row Corban College is ranked as a top ten Best Baccalaureate college in the west by US News and World Report. We are the only Christian College in the Northwest to be ranked in the top ten.
 - a. Ranked 4th. Highest ranking ever, last year Corban was ranked 6th.
2. Corban was also ranked as a Best Value by the magazine, ranked 5th in the West. Corban is the highest ranked Best Value for a Christian College in the Northwest.

3. 5th Highest graduation rate in the west. Highest among Christian colleges in the Northwest.
4. 6th highest freshmen to sophomore retention rate. Highest among Christian colleges in the Northwest.

Baccalaureate Colleges. These institutions focus primarily on undergraduate education, just as the liberal arts colleges do, but grant fewer than 50 percent of their degrees in liberal arts disciplines. At these schools, at least 10 percent of undergraduate degrees awarded are bachelor's degrees. There are 319 baccalaureate colleges, ranked within four regions: North, South, Midwest, and West.
